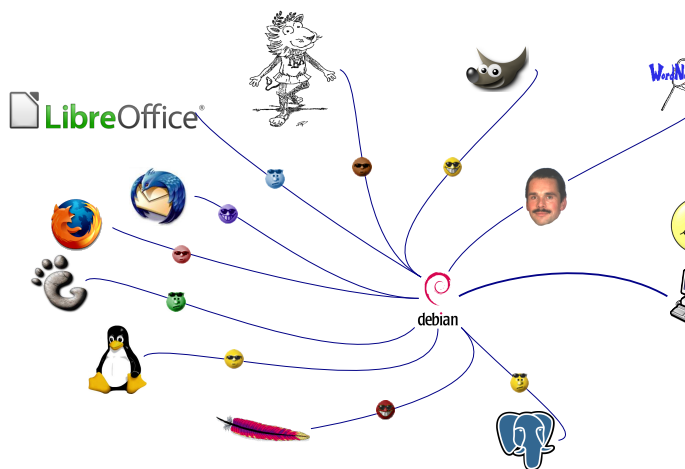

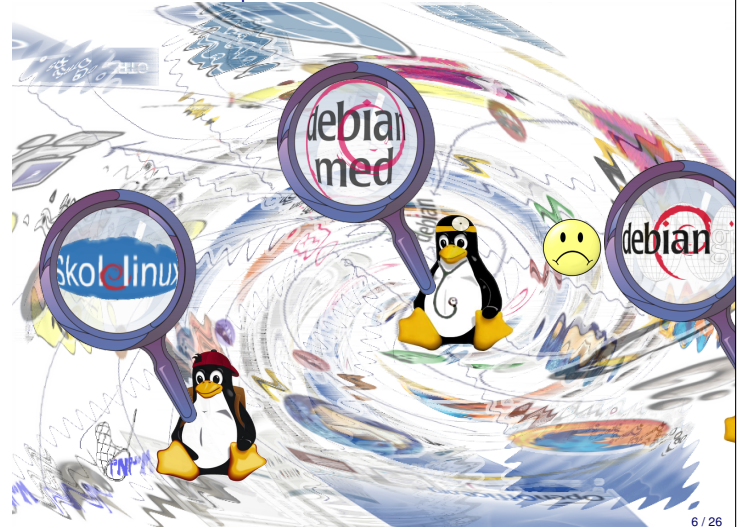

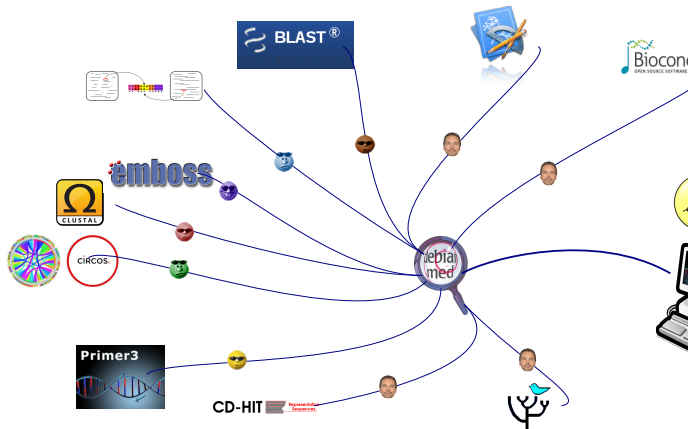

Role of Blends to attract specific users



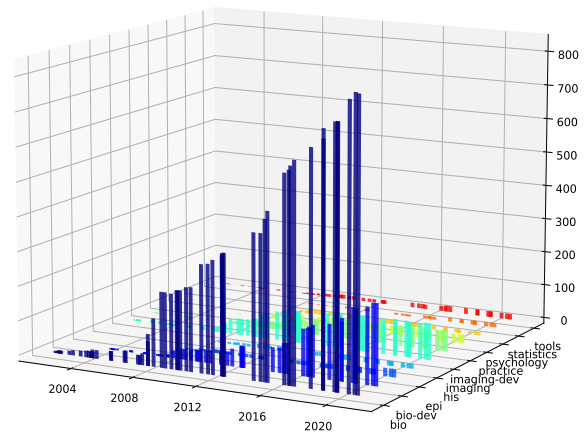

Debian Med has attracted one developer per year

According to a *survey* in Wiki

- Debian Med has 42 DDs+DMs (not all active any more)
- 20 DDs *because* Debian Med exists;
4 DDs before Debian Med started
- 10 out of the 20 above extended their activity to other fields in Debian
- 14 out of the 20 above are active in Debian Med
- 3 DDs and 1 DM are new after the April-Hackathon

... besides a stable but unspecific OS

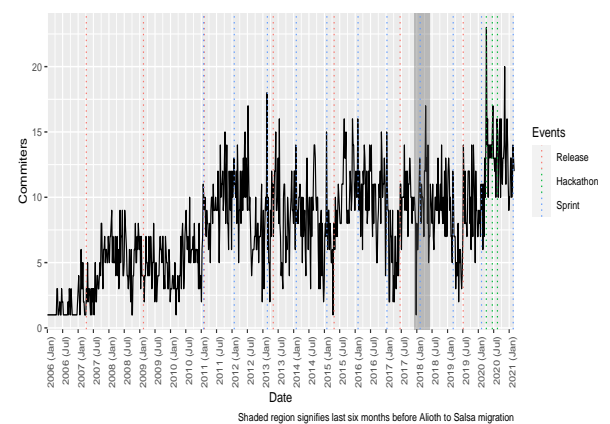

- Please note: R packages missing inside the graph since these are maintained in R packaging team

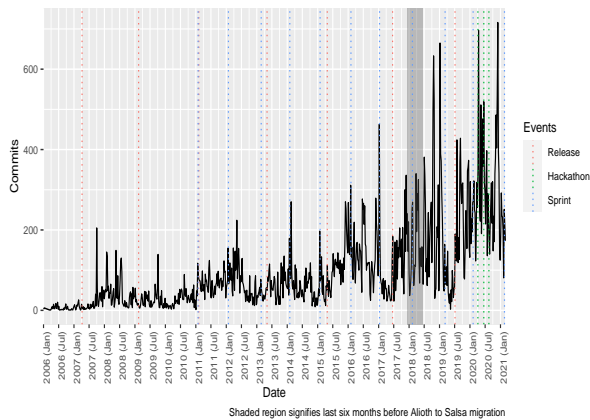

Persons committing to Debian Med packages per week



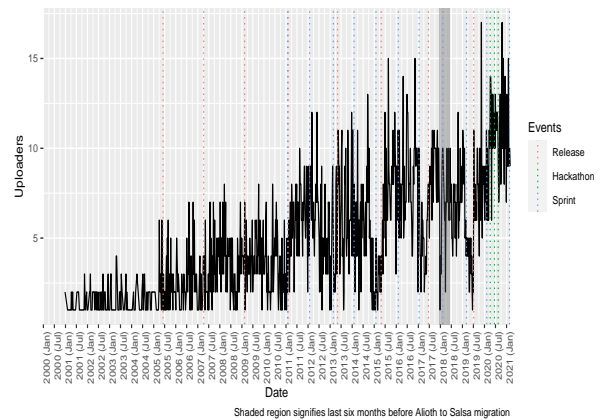

Commits to Debian Med packages per week



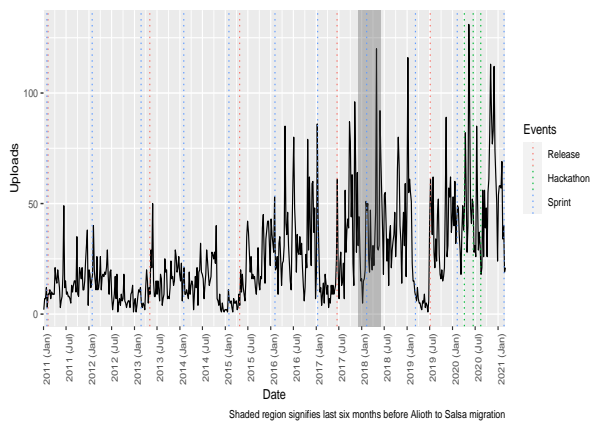

Persons uploading Debian Med packages per week



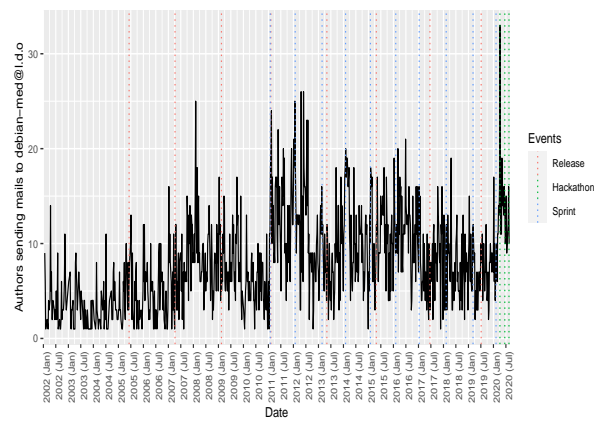

Uploads of Debian Med packages per week



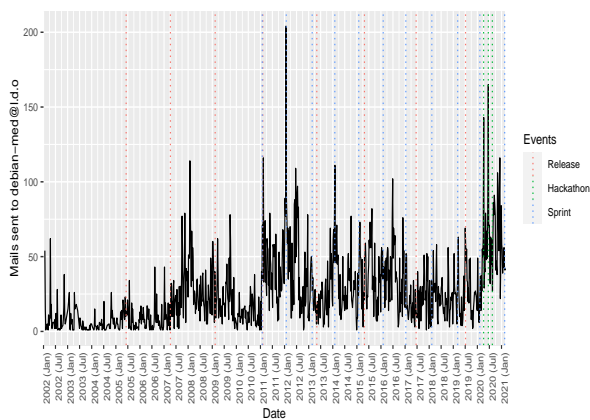
